

2013 Revenue Sources

Diversity: A casualty of lost affordability?



— Arlington Vision Statement [emphasis added]


Arlington values its progressive and inclusive tradition. But data (right) show that the County's income and ethnic diversity is changing.

Housing affordability is the foundation of a diverse and inclusive community. Though Arlington has long struggled to maintain a housing mix serving a range of income levels, that challenge has become a crisis with a major loss of affordable rentals since 2000.

Many factors may contribute to a household choice not to live in Arlington, but lack of housing affordability is likely the major driver.

Building support for solutions

For the Alliance for Housing Solutions, 2013 was a year of both building on existing foundations and taking some new directions. We:

- Continued our public education campaign, Arlington for Everyone: Housing for a Diverse and Sustainable Community, with outreach to teachers and PTA leadership, Leadership Arlington, seniors, and street fairs. Produced a first-of-its-kind advocacy source book for Arlington, Just the Facts.
- Together with the Arlington New Directions Coalition, formed HousingArlington, organizing housing providers and advocates to share information, strategize, and advocate regarding the range of housing issues in Arlington, including budget issues.



- Participated as the "housing advocate" representative on the Columbia Pike Neighborhoods Plan Financial Implementation Team.
- Began a dialogue with County Board members, County staff, and key local employers about the role of housing in Arlington's economic growth and stability.
- Teamed up with new partners (Arlington's Housing Division, the Mobility Lab, Nauck Community Services Center, and Virginia Tech) to produce an array of educational events during Affordable Housing Education Month.
- Produced the the 2013 State of Affordable
 Housing overview (preceded by a "special
 focus" panel on micro-units) as well as the
 11th Thomas P. Leckey Affordable Housing
 Forum, Building Support for Affordable
 Communities: Focusing the Message and
 Expanding the Base.





- Raised our profile at the State level with staff participation on a panel at the Virginia Governor's Housing Conference.
- Took action in support of affordable housing proposals, to create/preserve at least 90 affordable units.



 Celebrated Citizen³ Power at the 5th Ellen Bozman Affordable Housing Award Celebration.
